As part of our 5-year anniversary celebration, a Lunch and Learn event is set for Friday, May 1. Dr. John Derden, professor emeritus of history at East Georgia State College, will present *The Resurrection of Camp Lawton*. When it opened in October 1864, near Millen, Georgia, Camp Lawton was called "the world's largest prison." Operational for only six weeks, the prison served as headquarters for the Confederate military prison system. It was burned by Sherman's troops following its evacuation in late November 1864 and was never reoccupied. Over the next one hundred fifty years, the memory of Camp Lawton almost disappeared; however, in 2010, the Confederate military prison was resurrected as a result of extensive archeological investigations.

Dr. Derden is author of a recent book, *The Largest Prison in the World: The Story of Camp Lawton*, which provides a fascinating history of the camp. The event begins at noon. Registration fee is \$5, and lunch will be provided. Pre-registration is required; contact the Center to register or for additional information. We hope you'll join us for an intriguing look at what many believe to be one of the most pristine Civil War archaeological sites found in decades.


