SPOTLIGHT: TANNER PEEBLES

The Correll Scholars Program was established in 2014 and began Fall semester 2015 to recognize and prepare exceptionally promising students as future community leaders in our region. The scholarship awards \$5,000 per student, renewable annually, for a maximum of four years. Twenty scholarships are awarded each year. The students who are chosen for the scholarships must maintain a 3.0 GPA or higher, complete at least 26 credit hours in freshman year to maintain eligibility for sophomore year, participate in a one hour credit course each semester that focuses on issues and challenges facing our region and work collaboratively to design solutions for those challenges, and actively participate in tutoring and mentoring of local elementary school students at the Fulford Center.

Tanner Peebles, a Correll Scholar who participated in the tutoring program at the Fulford Center, was recently accepted into the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine on the Moultrie Campus. Tanner plans to become a Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine.

He graduated from EGSC with a Bachelor of Science in Biology degree in the Spring of 2020. As part of the Bachelor of Sciences in Biology, Tanner performed two internships: the first at Emanuel Medical Center located in Swainsboro, Ga, and the second at Washington County Regional Medical Center in Sandersville, Ga. In addition, he was a member of the STEM Mega student club, TriBeta Biology Honor Society, Phi Theta Kappa, Ambassadors Program, and was a member of the Student Government Association.

The Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine, a four-year medical school osteopathic program, was founded in 2019 to help grow the number of rural followed by two more years of course work combined physicians in Georgia.
