MARK YOUR CALENDAR! **AARP DRIVER SAFETY TRAINING SET FOR AUGUST 12**

The AARP Smart Driver™ course will be offered Monday, August 12. Founded in 1979, the course has helped millions of drivers stay safe on the roads. It is the nation's first and largest refresher course designed specifically for drivers age 50 and older.

The course will be held from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. AARP Driver Safety instructor, Marcia Parkerson, will teach defensive driving techniques and strategies, traffic laws, and rules of the road. There are no written exams or driving

Upon completion of the course, participants will receive a certificate of completion which, when presented to auto insurance carriers, often results in a reduction in automobile insurance premiums. Participants should contact their insurance agent for more details.

The cost of the course is \$15 for AARP members and \$20 for non-members. Registration is required and course participation is limited to 30.
