

## SAT REVIEW SESSIONS ARE SCHEDULED



SAT MATH REVIEW---September 29 through October 2 SAT CRITICAL READING/WRITING---October 6-9 All sessions will run from 4:00 p.m. until 5:30 p.m. The fee is \$10 for one week or \$15 for both weeks. Students will receive a test review packet and sample test sections. Students should contact their school counselor by September 22 to register.

There are many parts of a successful college application, the most important of which is high school grades. The second most important part is the SAT score.

In an effort to familiarize students with the SAT test directions, the types of questions on the test, and the necessary skills for SAT success in the math and verbal sections, the Fulford Center will offer two review sessions for area students.



### WEEKLY CHESS MEETINGS TO BE HELD AT CENTER

The Fulford Center will host an "Adult Chess League" which will meet each Tuesday evening throughout the fall and spring semesters. Each session will begin at 6:00 p.m. and conclude at 8:00 p.m.

There is no cost or expense, and tournament chess sets are used at each session. Participants do not need to have any particular expertise in chess. The league does request that all minors who want to attend be accompanied by a parent or guardian.



Several local chess enthusiasts provide valuable assistance with the sessions including Dr. John Simmons, retired math professor from East Georgia State College, John Blackburn, EGSC math professor, and Mike Lisenby, an adjunct professor who teaches Business Law at EGSC. Mike also coaches chess at several schools within the Emanuel County School District and assists with our chess camps each summer.

# **SMART DRIVER TRAINING SET FOR OCTOBER 30**







The AARP Smart Driver<sup>™</sup> course, the nation's first and largest driver safety course designed especially for drivers age 50+, will be offered October 30. The course is intended to help drivers live more independently as they age and remain safe on today's roads.

The course will be held from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. AARP Smart Driver<sup>TM</sup> instructor, Steve Flowers, will conduct the class. There are no written exams or driving tests

The course covers defensive driving techniques and the normal changes in vision, hearing, and reaction time associated with aging. It also provides practical techniques for adjusting to these changes to ensure the driver's own safety and that of others on the road.

Upon completion of the course, participants will receive a certificate of completion which, when presented to auto insurance carriers, often results in a reduction in automobile insurance premiums. Participants should contact their insurance agent for more details.

The cost of the course is \$15 for AARP members and \$20 for non-members.

Registration is required and course participation is limited to 30. Participants are asked to bring a sack lunch to the class. Contact the center to register.
